Our branch selected four middle school girls from Martinez and Pleasant Hill to attend the AAUW Tech Trek camp at the Sonoma State University campus. The following outstanding local seventh grade students were chosen because of their passion for math and science: Isabella Marazzani, Katelynn Massey and Rachel Snyder (Martinez Junior High School), and Haley Kropf-Redenzo (Seguoia Middle School).

Tech Trek, a program of AAUW California started in1998, is a Science and Math camp aimed to encourage girls who will be entering eighth grade in the fall to consider careers in (STEM) science/ technology/ engineering/math. The camp features hands-on activities in math, science, and related fields. All sleeping, eating, instructional, and recreational facilities are located on a variety of university campuses throughout California where camps are held. Campers

are exposed to programs in fields such as astronomy, engineering, chemistry, marine biology, and environmental studies to enhance their learning experience and introduce the students to a variety of potential career areas.

The students were honored at our May Brunch by our members, and their family and friends. They attended camp June 22rd thru the 28th. We will meet these girls again in September at our Membership Brunch where they will relay their camp experience to us.


