\*Did you miss LAF's Supreme Court Preview Call? You can read a summary <<http://listsrv.aauw.org/t/92495/4372255/2203/5/>> of our discussion. \*

On October 22, AAUW members across the country joined LAF staff to learn about the most important cases the court will hear this term. Federal courts are sometimes the last, best hope for women who have experienced discrimination in education, employment, or health care.

This year, the Supreme Court will consider a number of issues with the potential to significantly affect the rights of women and girls, including a case on interpreting the Pregnancy Discrimination Act and more fallout from the court's disastrous Hobby Lobby decision.

If you missed the call, We'll keep you updated on the cases as the court's term progresses. Look for information about our wrap-up call next summer once the court has issued its decisions.

Her Fellowship will enable her to earn her medical degree and return to Nigeria to help those girls.

Florence Adera, from Kenya, was an International Fellow in 2004-05 and this year was awarded an International Project Grant. She graduated from Oklahoma City University with an MA in education, curriculum and instruction. She works for Family Health International in Kisumu as an educational specialist and she is using the grant to work on a mentoring program to improve the academic performance of more than 500 girls.
