Fund History: 75 years ago AAUW's War Relief Committee officially begins to raise money through a war relief fund to assist European scholars and university women displaced by the occupation and no longer able to continue their work. The committee works tirelessly with the academic community to find teach positions for the women at schools and universities in the United States. Individual branch members also participate by signing immigration affidavits of support. In its inaugural year, the War Relief Committee raises \$29,950 for distribution with 350 branches contributing. Their efforts helped many women and saved many lives.
