All of this would not be possible without the generosity of our membership and the leadership of our chairpersons Marie Cattalini and Lynn Murphy (Local Scholarships), Janice Walker (Tech Trek), Harriet Burt and Helen Pereira (AAUW Funds). Heartfelt thanks to all of you.

For the 2015-16 year, our executive committee honored Janice Walker with the *Barbara Newacheck Award*. Outgoing co-presidents Gayle Miner and Trinka March were

named gift honorees by AAUW Funds. These three ladies epitomize the AAUW mission through their steadfast leadership and it was our privilege to present these awards to them.

Now, on to the present and future! On May 21, some of us attended East Bay District Leadership Training at Cal State East Bay in Concord. This is the Wider Circle showroom where families come in and pick out items for their homes.




This picture was taken after the opening session. I was able to network and meet many other college students and understand their goals and what they are doing on their campuses.
