Barbara Newacheck was a dynamic member of our Pleasant Hill Branch who embodied the values of AAUW. She passed away in 2004, and in 2005 the Barbara Newacheck Memorial Award was established to honor a member who, like Barbara did, advances the mission of AAUW through her contributions to the Branch and beyond.

Harriett Burt, a long time member of AAUW since 1962, is the recipient of the annual Barbara Newacheck award. She has worked tirelessly in AAUW to advance equity for women and girls through advocacy, education, philanthropy and research. Harriett has held numerous board positions during her membership: including President, Program Vice President (many times), AAUW Fund Vice President, and the appointed position of Community. She has been selected for the named Gift Honoree Award, and is the power behind the Kinder's sales. She is one of the hard core people you can count on to get things done.

Harriett also is active in our community. She
