One of the programs that AAUW Fund supports is the College /University (C/U) Partnerships. For colleges and universities who are partners, students are eligible for a free national membership and access to AAUW grants and fellowships, leadership training, professional development and advocacy tools. Another program is the Eleanor Roosevelt Fund which supports research on gender equity in education and the workplace.

Our other fundraiser was a success also. We were able to raise \$1,141.00 from the Kinder's coupon sales which is enough to send a student from DVC to NCCWSL which is a wonderful experience for the student.
