Helen and Harriett are looking forward to presenting Dr. Cheryl Dembe, Ph.D. to the Branch as she closes out the program year on Wednesday, April 15 telling the story about how she was deprived of her wellearned Ph.D. degree in a heretofore unexplored part of chemistry at the University of Chicago 48 years ago due to gender. A male graduate of Cornell developed a similar thesis two years later and was later awarded the Nobel Prize in Chemistry. Cheryl's way of causing the University not only to choose to award the degree last June but to publicly admit it had been wrong without her requesting it and without rancor is also inspiring. A male member of Martinez Kiwanis told me afterward that it was the best program he'd ever heard. While not as well-known as Betty Reid Soskin, Cheryl is equally inspiring and delightful.
