Tech Trek 2025 was better than ever for our campers, staff, and volunteers. Thank you all for

contributing and supporting this "amazing, awesome, inspirational, memorable, fun and intriguing experience. "

Our six campers were part of the ninety girls representing 16 branches that attended Camp Franklin. The core classes at Sonoma for 2025 were Aerospace Engineering, Botany, Chemistry, Electrical Engineering, and Forensics. All campers learned how to solder and make a flashlight, do coding with a STEM Lingo Robotics kit. They participated in many more workshops and evening activities. I hope you can make it to the Welcome Back Brunch and hear more from our Tech Trekkers, when they share their camp experiences and highlights from the week at Sonoma State.

Here are a few statistics from Tech Trek 2025 state wide: There were eight in-person camps at campuses across the state.; 700 campers completed in-person, 53 completed virtual.; 105 branches and organizations sponsored attendees across the state; over 450 volunteers contributed over 20,000 hours of their time; about half were former Trekkers!

Going forward, we are developing a Tech Trek Alumnae Community. Many other branches are working with their alumni by getting together virtually and in person, continuing the STEM momentum and friendships from camp. Sanvi Panda, Trekker from 2022, has been helping me with this project. We are looking for another member or two to join us and be an advisor for the group. Please contact me if you are interested. I am proposing we also connect with IBC local branches, some already have an active TTAG (Tech Trek Alumni Group).
